A ir pollution has become a problem all over the world. The release of harmful gases from industrial processes, vehicle emissions and burning trash has caused alot of damage to the environment around us and our health. Thailand is no exception.

A huge contributor to Thailand's pollution is the frequent practice of agricultural burning along with vehicle emissions and transboundary haze in rural areas. In rural areas most notably Chiang Mai agriculture burning and forest fires have increased the pollution levels in the region Industrial emissions are caused by the industrial growth of the country. Its capital city Bangkok which contains 60 to 70% of the county's industrial emissions has experienced a lot of pollution. So much that some schools had to be closed to protect the children from the polluted air.

Due to this the government has reacted deploying military and police to inspect the factories, adding more monitoring stations, and shutting down schools to protect the children. "While solutions like cloud seeding might have temporary relief it won't reduce PM2. 5.

The next logical step is to shut down the most polluting factories.

This might cause some economic damage but it must be done since protecting the people is the utmost priority" says Kakuko Nagatani Yoshida UN Environment's Regional Coordinator for chemicals, waste and air quality Nonetheless the country is taking action and hopefully the damage caused can be reversed as time goes by.

"I believe that this school offers an education that we can use to change the future, and also have a different way of looking at the world of learning. For the students, their parents believed that this was a good school for them."






TABLE TALK WITH MR. DAVID


HOW DO YOU SEE THE FUTURE OF BPIS?


Our school encourages the preservation of the Thai culture and language.
